The use of the Baltic Sea is increasing. With expanding activities like offshore wind energy parks, growing shipping traffic as well as environmental protection needs, an increasing number of users compete for a share of the limited and vulnerable Baltic Sea space.

One ecosystem, increasing use...would it then not be wise to use marine resources more efficiently through co-operation and co-ordination of the marine space?

What we do in PartiSEApate: PartiSEApate will develop and test methodologies for how to carry out multi-level Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) processes across national boundaries in three concrete pilot projects (Pomeranian Bight, Middle Bank and Lithuanian Sea). Through PartiSEApate, the bodies responsible for MSP across the Baltic Sea Region have joined forces in order to develop a pan-Baltic approach to topics whose spatial dimension transcends sectoral and administrative borders.

Maritime Spatial Planning: Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) has become the widely acknowledged and necessary tool for coordinating and balancing the spatial use of the sea. It aims to balance the interests of often competing sectors so that the marine space and resources are used efficiently and sustainably.
